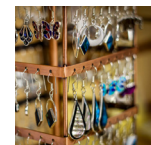

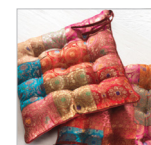

Paul Allen Knowledge and Outreach Coordinator, CAT

Paul Allen has worked at CAT and its spin-out businesses for 34 years, initiating ‘ahead of the curve’ research projects. Backed by strong technical and practical experience, Paul has led the ground-breaking Zero Carbon Britain research for over 12 years, leading on the development of six reports and liaising directly with government, business, public sector and the arts to share their findings. He has a wide breadth of public speaking experience from UNFCCC COP conferences to local council training.



Dieter Brandstätter Engagement Ranger, CAT

Dieter has worked at CAT for the last 5 years teaching on short courses, operating the funicular railway and making products for the site. He designed and built a CNC machine (that has the capability of running off solar power) and a wind tunnel (for use in the graduate school). Initially training in Silversmithing and Product Design, his interests lie in the sustainable values of materials, and the spatial experience in buildings.



Aileen Burmeister Head of Fair Trade Wales

Aileen has been heading up Fair Trade Wales since 2018 after a history of campaigning against global inequality and raising awareness by working in schools and charities. She enjoys working on community engagement, boring details of global trade deals and trying tasty new Fair Trade products. Fair Trade Wales works with over 30 Fairtrade communities, 200 schools, 18 local authorities and eight Fair Trade retailers, and connects with faith groups, universities and businesses in Wales each year. They also coordinate campaigns and events and are the only national Fair Trade organisation in Wales to offer Welsh-language resources for the whole of Wales.



Tamara Cobussen Guarantee System Manager, WFTO

Tamara has been the WFTO’s Guarantee System Manager for nearly 9 years and was, until recently, the acting CEO. She works hard to ensure that the Guarantee System continues to be credible and evolve while understanding the needs of its members. She became involved with Fair Trade some twenty years ago through her internship in Ghana with the Dutch Centre for the Promotion of Import from Developing Countries (CBI) along with her time at Trade Aid in New Zealand.



Christine Gent Fair Trade Expert, MADE51 WFTO

Global Network Director for Fashion Revolution CIC and Founder of Fairly Covered and FAIR shop, Christine is a recognised expert in Fair Trade with over 25 years’ experience of working with all aspects of supply chain management, advocacy and campaign work. However, it is with her MADE51 hat on that Christine comes to the BAFTS conference. Created by UNHCR, the high commission for refugees, MADE51 is a global organisation bringing beautiful refugee made products to a global market.



Mercy Imondi Founder, Flowering Desert Project

With a background in Mathematics and Nursing, Mercy is the owner of the Flowering Desert Production Unit in India. The 45 staff employed by the project make handmade jewellery and organic hand embroidered textile products commissioned by clients for the export market. This employment provides skills training and an income for vulnerable women as well as offering them hope through emotional, physical, spiritual and practical support. Her life’s motto is: ‘pursue your dream, not money’.



Faith Israel Diaspora and Inclusion Officer, Sub-Sahara Advisory Panel

Faith is passionate about global solidarity, particularly the ways in which struggles for liberation are connected, black British life, political memory, art, gender and ensuring that the diaspora is always on the Welsh Africa agenda. Faith brings wide-ranging inclusion to all aspects of the Sub-Sahara Advisory Panel’s work with Hub Cymru Africa. Outside of Faith’s work, they enjoy reading fiction by black authors, cooking and archiving the black experience.



Martha Musonza Holman Founder, Love Zimbabwe Charity/Love Zimbabwe Fair Trade CIC

Martha Musonza Holman, founder of Love Zimbabwe Charity and Love Zimbabwe Fair Trade CIC, migrated from Zimbabwe to the UK in 2001. Since then, she has worked in over 300 schools in Wales and different community organisations facilitating talks on Fairtrade. She was part of the campaign for Wales to become the first fairtrade nation in 2008. Martha has recently been awarded Winner of the Hub Cymru Africa’s Individual Volunteers award which recognises her work in overcoming adversity to make a positive impact both in Wales and in Zimbabwe. “Through supporting community-led initiatives, Martha is strategic in recognising and working to influence gatekeepers and decision makers”, with judges commenting that “she has left something tangible on the ground to be proud of”.



Kevin Rahman-Daultrey Policy and Education Manager, Size of Wales

Having worked in the third sector for most of his career, Kevin joined Size of Wales in January 2020 to focus on his passion for the environment and sustainability. With an academic background in Environmental Sciences, he has previously worked on inclusivity in transport and cycling, as a development worker in some of the most deprived areas of Wales and on links between the third sector and the NHS. He believes that natural solutions are the key in tackling our climate emergency.



Kadun Rees Community & Communications Officer, Fair Trade Wales

Kadun joined the Fair Trade Wales team last year to take on the role of Communications and Community Officer. With a degree in International Relations and Politics from Cardiff University, he is particularly interested in trade, development and climate justice.
